

## **Adapting to Climate Change – Case Studies from the Baltic Sea Region**

Actions towards establishing sustainable adaptation measures to climate change are currently taking place at various levels. An increasing number of projects are launched to identify the regional and local impact of climate change and to find suitable adaptation options for the relevant decision-makers from the policy and the economy sector. Together, the Hamburg Senate Chancellery and the Helmholtz-Zentrum Geesthacht are hosting a conference on regional and local adaption to climate change in the Baltic Sea Region on the 31 May 2011 in Hamburg.

The key objective of this conference is to give practitioners and decision-makers at the regional political level in the Baltic Sea Region a platform to present and discuss concrete examples of regional or local adaption to climate change. The conference is specifically dedicated to administrators and decision-makers who must account for effects of climate change in their region or municipality. It provides the opportunity to discuss climate related issues with international experts and to build and foster a network of practitioners facing similar problems regarding adaptation to climate change in their regions.
